Example 1:

Book with two authors

Here's what it should look like, if the citation were entered here in the body of your paper.
(Carpenter & Huffman, 2008)

And here's how it looks in the References section at the end of your paper:

Carpenter, S., & Huffman, K. (2008). *Visualizing psychology*. Hoboken, NJ: John Wiley & Sons.

Example 2

E-text from an electronic database (course textbooks)

Here's what it should look like, if the citation were entered here in the body of your paper. (Smith, 2009)

And here's how it looks in the References section at the end of your paper:

Example 3: Journal/Magazine Article Based on a print source.

Here's what it should look like, if the citation were entered here in the body of your paper. (Bowers, 2007)

And here's how it looks in the References section at the end of your paper:

Bowers, B. (2007, May/June). Are you ready to start your own business? *AARP Magazine*, 23(6), 63-65.

Example 4: Journal/Magazine Article from an online database, with url

Here's what it should look like, if the citation
were entered here in the body of your paper.
(Gaumnitz & Lere, 2004)

And here's how it looks in the References section
at the end of your paper:

Example 7: Online Newspaper/Magazine Article

Example 8: Website, no author, & no date

And here's how it looks in the References section at the end of your paper:

A short guide on leadership traits. (n.d.).

Example 9: Video Weblog (YouTube Video)
